Old Skool Café is a 1940's style, jazz-themed supper club run by at-risk youth, which provides training, jobs and a second chance at life for youth coming out of incarceration, foster care and other challenging life circumstances.

Headquartered in Bayview / Hunter's Point, Old Skool Café is an intensive real-world vocational training ground, employment incubator, supportive cohort, income generator, and connection point with a larger community that champions their success.

Our cuisine is traditional southern soul food as you would think of, but with the addition of international dishes, because every culture has its own version of comfort food. Our youth come from different cultures and backgrounds. We celebrate this by learning about their favorite family recipe and highlighting them on our menu. Dinner is accompanied by live entertainment by youth performers, from jazz to classical and everything in between.





Old Skool Café was founded in 2004 by Teresa Goines and has received several awards and recognition for helping youth break the cycle of incarceration and poverty.

Since opening, the restaurant has been featured on national media outlets including CNN Heroes, Diane Sawyer, Rachael Ray Show, The Chew, The Steve Harvey Show, E! Entertainment, Grub Street, and Huffington Post, as well as on local and regional San Francisco Bay area outlets such as San Francisco Chronicle, The Bay Citizen, Eat Speak SF, Bay Area Check Please, Asterisk San Francisco, Thrillist SF, The Infatuation SF and more.


### **About Teresa Goines**

Teresa Goines is the founder and CEO of Old Skool Café. Her experience working with gang-affiliated youth, as a juvenile correction officer, impacted her life in a way that changed her forever. Their stories gave her an in-depth understanding of how many young people end up on such a destructive path and compelled her to find a solution to the hopelessness she saw in the lives of incarcerated and forgotten youth.

Ms. Goines' mission is to permanently break the cycle of incarceration by giving young people hope, economic opportunities and training in a supportive environment where they can grow emotionally, physically and spiritually.

From this passion, the concept of Old Skool Cafe was born in 2004.

## Our Achievements



More than 600 youth have received workforce training and mentorship at Old Skool Café.

100% of youth who enter the Old Skool Café 101 Training program gain employment thereafter.

90% of youth who graduate the Old Skool Café 101 Training program will continue their employment or focus on school full time.

Of those who graduate 101 Bootcamp, 100% will:

- Receive a Food Handler's Permit
- Obtain Financial Literacy training
- Create a Goal Plan and learn how to take weekly steps to achieve those goals
- Obtain a Resume and Cover letter
- Sharpen interview and networking skills
- Develop public speaking skills
- Understand time management skills
- Complete one give-back project
- Re-engage and make progress towards completely High
   School diploma (if not already graduated)

In addition, 100% of those who graduate 101 Bootcamp receive:

- Weekly personal coaching and be connected with wrap-around support services as needed through our partners.
- Support in opening a bank account and a savings account.
- On-going life skills and mentorship.
- Exposure to a variety of careers and opportunities.
- Connection into a supportive community!

Recidivism rate for justice-involved youth after 1 year in OSC program is less than 15% compared to the national average of 76%
